Our Mission

At OnSite Dermatology, our goal is to provide quality and convenient dermatologic care directly at your community—eliminating the need for residents to travel off-site for treatment. We specialize in serving senior living communities by bringing care directly to them.

Scope of Services

We bring the medical office to your residents and staff, offering a wide range of on-site dermatology services, including:

- Full Body Skin Exams
- Treat Common Skin Conditions
- Biopsies
- Cryotherapy (Treatment for Pre-Skin Cancer)
- ED&C (Electrodesiccation and Curettage) - Skin Cancer treatment

Please note, we cannot perform the following on-site:

1. Radiation therapy
2. Procedures requiring sutures
3. MOHS surgery

**If a biopsy indicates one of these treatments is necessary, we will refer the patient to local providers who accept their insurance.*

Monthly Visit Process

We will establish a monthly recurring visit date with your community.

About 1 Month Prior to the visit date:

- We send a flyer and sign-up sheet to your key community contacts.
- Anyone in need of services should be added to the sign-up list.
- Resident information may be submitted at any time, but must be received **at least 3 business days** before the visit.

Before the Visit

- Our scheduling team verifies insurance and contacts POAs, if needed, to obtain consent.
- We send the finalized schedule of who will be seen.
- **Visit notes** are shared via a SharePoint folder link sent by email. Notes will be uploaded after our visit and remain accessible for 2 weeks.
 - **Please note: SharePoint and other Microsoft platforms typically require the Microsoft Edge browser to open properly.**

After the Visit

- We handle all follow-ups.
- Biopsy results — both positive and negative — are sent to the community. *(N/A for IL resident results)*
- POAs are contacted only if results are positive, so we can discuss treatment plans directly.
